ping passing to and from Virginia, New-England and the Bernande Ilands, and also any other shipping that shall valle to and from the River of Canady and the coast thereof; because they vinally passe, and so returne in sight of the land of Trepalley ; and also for some other purposes, as. shall be parely declared in the following Discourse.

But I will not infift upon for ther particulars of Harbors in this place, feeing our men that yerely trade to that Coast, know them to be as good and commodious

Harbours, as any other what soener,

The foyle of this Countrey, is so fruitfull, as that in di- The fertility of uers places, there the summer naturally produceth out of the sople. the fruitfull wombe of the earth, without the labour of mans hand great plenty of greene Peale & Fitches, faire, round full and wholeforne as our Firehes are in England of which I have there fed on many times: the hawmen of them are good fodder for cattell and other beafts, in the winter, with the helpe of Have of which there may be made great flore with little labour, in divers places of the Countrey. Then have you there faire Strawberries, scurraliforting red and white, and faire Respasse berries and Goose-fruits there berries, as there bee in England; as also multitudes growing. of Bilberries, which are called by fome, Whortes, and many other delicate Berries (which I cannot name) in great abundance. There are also many other fruits, as fmall Peares, Cherries, Filberds, 85c. And of these Berries & fruits the flore is there forgreat that the Mariners of my Ship and Barkes company have gathered as once, more then halfe an hoginead would hold; of which divers times eating their fill, I never heard of any man, whose health was thereby any way impaired.

There are also herbes for Sallers and Broth; as Parkley, Alexander, Sorrell, Sec. And also flowers, as the red and white Damaske Role, with other kinds; which are most beautifull
