INTERNATIONAL COLONIAL EXHIBITIONS ANTWERP IN 1885—LONDON IN 1886.

It is the intention to have a Canadian representation at the International Exhibition at Antwerp, commencing in May, 1885, and also at the Colonial and Indian Exhibition to be held in 1884.

The Government will defray the cost of freight in conveying Canadian Exhibits to Antwerp, and from Antwerp to London, and also in returning them to Canada in the event of their not being sold.

All Exhibits for Antwerp should be ready for shipment not later than the first week in March next. These Exhibits, if well selected, will afford favourable opportunity for showcasing the natural capabilities and manufacturing and industrial progress of the Dominion.
