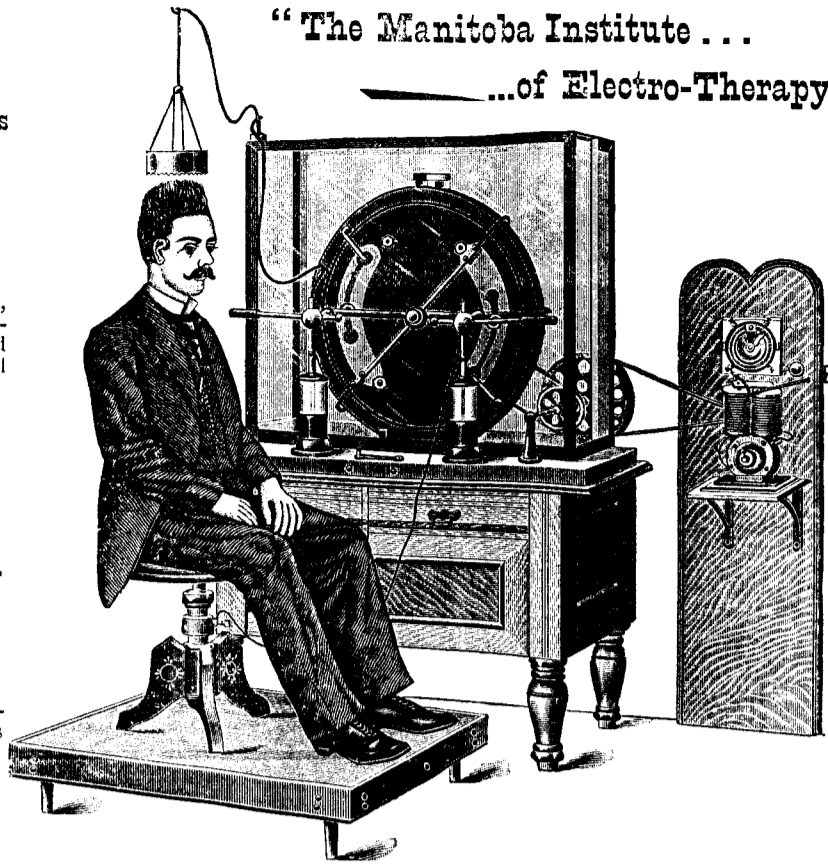

Rev. Fr. George Deshon was recently elected Superior General of the Paulist Congregation, which he has practically governed for the last few years of Father Hewit's declining health. Fr.
