

By using the system, companies can identify competitive Canadian manufacturing companies - helping in the effort to substitute Canadian goods and services for imported ones when price and quality are comparable.

In widening its network, BOSS has already published specialized directories on automotive parts, health care products, customs brokers and freight forwarders, trading houses, construction companies, agrologists, architects, mapping and surveying, consulting engineers, and management consultants.

As to updates, they are done on a continuous basis, with the on-line system, providing the most current information available. Company and product information is updated annually for approximately 75 per cent of those listed. On request, the rest are updated every second year.

The system also is being refined and expanded so that the data base will include marine shipping, offshore vessels and computer software and services - in addition to the actual manufacturing and service sectors.

For instance, on-line users can request a listing of all Canadian companies located in a particular province, which export a product into Europe or elsewhere. More detailed analyses of the data are available on request from the analysts at BOSS headquarters.

Companies may freely be listed in BOSS. Currently subscriptions to the directories or the on-line service are also free. The directories can be consulted at any of the 77 branch offices across Canada of the Federal Business Development Bank.

Both registration and subscription forms are available at the nearest office of the Department of Regional Industrial Expansion (DRIE); or companies may contact the Business Opportunities Sourcing System at DRIE, 235 Queen St., Ottawa K1A 0H5, tel: (613) 954-5031, indicating if they wish to register or become subscribers. If the latter, companies must specify, in writing, the purpose for which they intend to use the system. *
