PRAYERS.

Mr. McCubbin, Parliamentary Assistant to the Minister of Agriculture, presented,—Return to an Order of the House of May 26, 1952, for a Return showing:—1. Were hog prices supported in 1951 by the Government being prepared to purchase Wiltshire sides?

- 2. If so, at what price was the Government prepared to buy Wiltshire sides, basis Halifax, Montreal, Toronto, Winnipeg, Saskatoon, Calgary and Vancouver?
- 3. What floor price for dressed carcasses should such a floor price have established at the same marketing points?
  - 4. On what basis are hog prices presently being supported?
- 5. What is the present support price for Wiltshire sides at Halifax, Montreal, Toronto, Winnipeg, Saskatoon, Calgary and Vancouver?
- 6. What price for the dressed hog carcasses should such a floor price establish at the same marketing points?
- 7. What is the present floor price, if any, at the above points, for hogs grading extra heavy and No. 1 and No. 2 sows?
- 8. In what form, or by what method, will the Government purchase hogs going into the above grades?

The Bill No. 181, An Act respecting Allowances for War Veterans and their Dependants, was read the third time and passed.
