Business of the House

first quarter of 1958 with 141,000 head being exported, compared with only 8,000 head in the first quarter of 1957.

Exports of beef in 1957 amounted to 48.5 million pounds and were 13.8 million pounds in 1956. Exports of beef in the first quarter of 1958 continued to be large and totalled 15.7 million pounds compared with 2.9 million pounds in 1957.
