Dr. James Douglas Fleck, Associate Dean of the Faculty of Administrative Studies, York University, Toronto, is also a member. Departmental representatives are F. L. Worrall, D. G. Black, J. I. Carmichael, and T. C. Porter. The Task Force is conducting an analysis of government involvement in the transportation field for the purposes of clarifying the Department's objectives and establishing the Department's roles vis-à-vis those of other departments and agencies engaged in various aspects of the transportation function.
- 3. It is expected that their work will be completed by this fall, and it is intended
