

allow Germany to rearm. In doing so we will not only be doing right by ourselves but we will be giving leadership to the smaller nations. Because they will take their leadership from us, I think we should be clear and unanimous in our support of the treaty.

In conclusion may I say, Mr. Speaker, that I have enjoyed the period during which you have presided over the sittings of this house. I have also enjoyed my relationship with the honourable Leader of the Government (Hon. Mr. Macdonald), and I congratulate him upon

the fine job he is doing. While I do not always agree with him, I know where he stands and the reason for his stand. I am sure that as Leader of the Government in this house he is trying just as I, the Leader of the Opposition, am trying to do—to be of the highest possible service to the people of Canada.

On motion of Hon. Mr. Macdonald, the debate was adjourned.
