grades. That limit will now be eliminated and all cattle will be paid for at the market value, except that the new rates of \$140 and \$70 will be paid for cattle slaughtered pursuant to an area or herd disease eradication program, which covers only tuberculosis and brucellosis.

Hon. Mr. Taylor (Westmorland): May I ask if it is the intention of the Government then to establish the whole country as an area and do the testing under an area program in so far as tuberculosis and brucellosis are concerned?

Hon. Mr. White: I am advised by the department that the whole country is now covered as far as tuberculosis is concerned, and starting this week or within a few days all Canada with the exception of Newfoundland will be under the brucellosis test program.

This program started only last year, and the figure I gave for April 30, 1957 to April 30, 1958, did not include Newfoundland, Quebec, Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, but they will all be in it now, with the exception of Newfoundland.

Motion agreed to and bill read second time.

The Hon. the Speaker: Honourable senators, when shall the bill be read the third time?

Hon. Mr. White: Next sitting.

The Senate adjourned until tomorrow at 3 p.m.
