New-York, according to their divisional Line settled with the Proprietors of East- Jerseys, Anno 1719, by Commissioners appointed by the Legillatures of both Provinces, and confirmed by the King in Counil. V. The East and Weste Jerseys, two diffinct Grants : the Proprietors furrendred the Government to the Crown, Anno 1702. Being small the Crown has united them, under one Jurisdiction or Government. V.I. Penfylvania ; Two diffinct Governments or : Legiflatures, but under one Governor ; because the Property of one Family. VII. Maryland, Lord Baltimere's Property. The . Boundaries not as yet fettled. with Penn's Family.
