

## THE COAL TRADE.

We have received Mr. Frederick A Sarvand's eighth annual review of the coal trade, and we shall endeavor to furnish our readers with some of the statistics most likely to be interesting to them. The latest information relates to the year 1880, and in some cases it is as old as 1879. In the latest of those years the production of Great Britain, the greatest in the world, was 134 millions of tons; of the United States, which comes next, 60 millions; Germany, 47 millions; Nova Scotia, 788,000 tons; Australia, 1,750,000; and Vancouver's Island, 250,000 tons. We need not give details from other countries. The exports from the United States to Quebec, Ontario, Manitoba and the North West are stated to have been 320,726 tons of anthracite and 129,217 of bituminous. The exports to Nova Scotia, New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island were
