It has been indicated that the United States wheat export will still further decline, but this may be more than counterbalanced by the increased exportation of Canada and Argentina. Even though the world's wheat demand will yearly increase as population increases, and nations with a low standard of living adopt wheat as their chief bread product, yet America, it would seem, will still keep her place as a wheat exporter. There is probably more chance of new wheat lands being developed in America than in Manchuria, arid and semi-arid Australia, India, and the other possible wheat lands in Africa and Asia.
