THE ORGANIZATION OF THE LODGE.

Every new lodge should be solemnly constituted by the M.W. the Grand Master, or in the absence of the Grand Master by the Deputy G. M., or the R. W. the District Deputy Grand Master of the District, who shall choose some Master of a lodge to assist him. If both those officers be unable to act the Grand Master may appoint some other Grand officer or Past Master of a lodge to act as his deputy. No warrant for a new private lodge shall be granted until, in addition to the ordinary recommendation of the District Deputy Grand Master, there is furnished by that officer a certificate to the effect that the lodge working under dispensation and seeking a warrant has provided itself with suitable furniture.

When the petition is duly signed it is sent to the District Deputy Grand Master of the District, who communicates with the Grand
