BUILDING BOOM NOW

ON IN BRANTFORD Permits Have Already Been Issued for 126 Houses—Also a Hundred Applications.

Special to The Toronto World. Brantford, May 29. - A building boom seems to be striking this city, particularly with regard to homes. Permits have already been issued for 126 homes, and there are over 100 applications for loans from the housing commission in addition. To date \$377,000 in permits have been issued —more than the total for 1916 and 1917 —and the activity has resulted in such a shortage of brick that an old brickyard is being put into shape, and all others are working to their full capacity. The latest proposal is for the erection of a modern apartment house here, local financiers having the matter under consideration.
