FERGUSON DENIES HE WAS CHOSEN

Former Minister Says Caucus Did Not Pick Him as Leader.

Referring to the account of the Conservative gathering in Toronto on Oct. 31 in the press despatches, and the statement that Hon. G. Howard Ferguson was selected as leader, Mr. Ferguson gave out the following in a Saturday evening:

"I was not selected as leader, or even temporary leader, at the caucus on Friday. The question of choosing a leader was left in abeyance. It was decided to call a provincial convention, and the manner and time of calling that convention was left in the hands of a committee, of which I am chairman. The other members of the committee are: Brig-Gen. Hon. A. H. Ross, Lieut. W. H. H. G. Lett, Capt. J. S. E. Thompson, Capt. Buckland, Chas. McCrear, Dr. Forbes Godfrey, W. C. Chambers, W. D. Black, Wm. Wolcott, John Joynt, and Peter Gardiner."

"Some provision will undoubtedly be made for a temporary leader, but the question of selecting a permanent leader will have to be decided by a convention of the Liberal-Conservative party of Ontario, along with all other matters of policy."

Hotel Fire in Belmont, Man., Causes Loss of Two Lives

Belmont, Man., Nov. 2.—Two lives were lost in an early morning fire which destroyed the Trafalgar Hotel here today. Joseph Thompson and a girl from Toronto, whose names are unknown, but who was called Hilda, Joseph Venier, the proprietor, his wife and four small children, escaped in their night clothes. James Decker, a returned soldier, was seriously injured in jumping from a third-story window. Other guests also got out by jumping.
