CANNIBAL KING AMAZES

Nigerian Monarch at Paris Behaves Better Than a Russian Duke.

Paris. Nov. 6.-The officials of th colonial ministry, as well as hotel and lightfully disappointed in King Mademba, who, under French protection rules over a savage kingdom of 12,000 square miles in the heart of Nigeria.

Paris expected to find in this African monarch a dissipated savage like King Sisowath of Cambodia. Instead, Mademba strikingly exemplifies the effect of civilizing influence on natural intongue. He dresses like a deputy, has the discretion of a minister and the manners of an ambassador.


