ed to be held in check late in the afternoon. Wild Scenes. While the firemen were in the centre of the city a half mile square of the residential section was in flames and no protection was available...

The flames reached Broadway, the principal street of the city at a point between Third and Fifth-streets, and destroyed the Masonic building, Odell's Hall and the Bennett block.

The firemen were ordered to sweep the streets with high-pressure water, and the fire was extinguished by half past two.

At City Hall Square. The greatest damage was done when the fire first broke out in the square. The First Baptist Church caught fire at the top of the spire.

For a time it looked as if the magnitude of the disaster might be overwhelming, but for a moment, however, for about 3 o'clock a tiny flickering flame was seen rising from under the coping of the cupola.

Down Maverick, Congress and Essex-streets the fire went by leaps and bounds. A four-story brick building built in 1880, known as the "Crown Building," was the first to be destroyed.

Down to the water front swept the flames. Factories along Maverick and Congress-streets were scores of families burned out and homeless.

Oil Tanks Ignite. Suddenly there was a terrific explosion and the oil tanks of the Tide-water Oil Co. on the water front in the vicinity of Marginal and High-land-streets burst into flames.

Among those who did effective work in saving the more precious of their church's belongings were Sisters Constance and Lucy Elizabeth Ellegood, nuns of the St. Francis convent.

Two Hospitals Burned. The Fitz Public Library, a magnificent stone structure, was destroyed, and on the flames crept toward the Frost Hospital and the Children's Hospital.
