Engineer Pinned by Locomotive in Four Feet of Coo.

BINGHAMPTON, N. Y., May 25.—Word has been received of a peculiar accident on the new Delaware and Eastern Railroad, near Margaretville, yesterday afternoon, when the locomotive and baggage car of a passenger train left the track and rolled down an embankment into the river. Engineer Clarence Coven was caught under the engine in about four feet of water. He was held there for four hours before he could be released. Members of the train crew were able to hold his head above water during that time. He was finally rescued, his only injury being a bruise on the head. The passenger car did not leave the track and the engineer was the only person injured.

GREAT FLOODS TEXAS
LIFE AND PROPERTY LOSSThousands Homeless and Railway
Traffic Thruout Large Section
Completely Paralyzed.

DALLAS, Tex., May 25.—Four lives lost, more than a million dollars worth of property destroyed, 4,000 persons homeless and telegraph and telephone wires west and southwest put out of commission are the results of an overflow of Trinity River last night and to-day. The poor residence quarter of Dallas is under several feet of water, and thousands have lost their household effects.

The waterworks plant is out of commission, and the light plant is inundated. Mayor Hay has issued a proclamation closing all business houses from 7:30 o'clock to-night until 5 o'clock to-morrow morning. Funds were raised to-day for the relief of the homeless.

At Dallas to-day a section of the Texas & Pacific Railway bridge was washed out and dozens of men were thrown into the river, six of them being drowned.

Waco reports the Brazos River higher than ever known. The flood caused great damage to the crops along the Brazos and its tributaries. Railroads in the vicinity of Waco also report considerable damage and delay to traffic.

Telegraphic communication to the west from Dallas is almost completely cut off.

At 2 o'clock to-day Trinity River had reached a stage of 53.3, the highest ever known. The situation grows worse every hour. It is now estimated that 2,000 people are homeless in Dallas. The electric-light plant is flooded, and the city was in darkness to-night.

7 Drowned.

FORT WORTH, Texas, May 25.—Seven people are known to be dead, 5,000 are homeless, a dozen or more are reported to have been killed in Port Worth and North Fort Worth as a result of the greatest rise in the history of Trinity River, which, beginning at 7:30 Saturday evening, reached a climax at 5 o'clock Sunday afternoon. Five of the deaths occurred to-day and two last night.

Following the torrential rains of Saturday and Sunday, a volume of seven inches, the river went higher, and the stock valued at many thousands of dollars was washed down stream and destroyed. The property loss cannot be estimated as yet.

The paralysis of railroad service is almost total. The Texas & Pacific, Atchafalaya, and Santa Fe railroads have been compelled to abandon traffic to the west, owing to several bridges being swept out by the high waters.

Drownings at Oklahoma.

OKLAHOMA CITY, Ok., May 25.—Five persons are known to have lost their lives in floods of Oklahoma. Several others narrowly escaped drowning and three are known to have been seriously injured.
