Most of the damage, as reported, was in Buenos Ayres and Santa Fe, and these provinces are the largest producers, with an acreage of 9,921,000 and a crop of 110,-016,000 bushels in 1906 and 1907.

Price Current says: Rains have given important relief from drought. Winter wheat is responding to needed moisture and looks more encouraging, but more rain is desired; the acreage may fall below last year. Some seeding may still be done. Corn is yielding up to expectations, packing 605,000, against 360,000.

The Northwestern Miller's weekly flour trade says: Minneapolis mills made 320,-420 barrels flour last week, a decrease of 26,310 from the previous week. The output of the present week promises to approximately 1,442,000 bushels wheat. Receipts were less, and shipments were 2,115,000 bushels against 1,530,000 bushels last year. The flour trade for the week was of an indifferent character.

# 163 CARS AT CITY YARDS

Prices for These Grade 15c to 25c Lower-Sheep and Calves Steady -Lambs Firmer-Hogs \$6.

Receipts of live stock at the city market, as reported by the railways, were 163 car loads, 2821 cattle, 3450 hogs, 2127 sheep and lambs, 81 calves and one horse.

For many weeks past common, light, immature cattle have been coming on this market too freely to suit the demand. For three weeks past the market has been flooded with that kind of cattle, which were extremely hard to sell. The receipts are too large to suit local dealers. The result has been a slow, dull, stagnant trade, with prices 15c to 25c lower for this class of cattle this week. And there does not seem any disposition on the part of the farmers to hold these cattle back, as grass is scarce on account of dry weather and they lack confidence in the future to commence to feed high-priced grain and winter feed to this class of cattle. On account of this heavy delivery of common stuff, prices were at the lowest point of the season.




