

Getting Ready For Big Fat Stock Show

Executive Will Meet on Tuesday to Appoint Manager and Secretary.

Arrangements for the National Fat Stock Show in Exhibition Park in November and January are being forwarded with every anticipation of giving the Dominion the very best in the interests of stock raisers. The executive will meet Tuesday afternoon in the city hall, to appoint a manager and a secretary, and to decide upon the amount of money to be appropriated for prizes.

There are available men who are qualified for the management, and who will take it at a salary that will not embarrass the treasury. The selection of manager will be readily disposed of. The salary will not be large for the manager or the secretary until the fair has developed to be a good paying proposition.

All of the interested organizations that will take part in the show have been notified to send representatives to the meeting on Tuesday, who will report upon prize lists and prizes required. Horticulturalists and dog fanciers are ready now to report, and the poultry men will meet Monday evening to prepare their report.

Controller Foster will propose to the dairymen that they make the best possible exhibit at the November show, and the executive will help them to the limit to make the dairy show in January all that could be desired. The dairymen have already offered to adopt this plan. It has yet to be decided whether the dairymen will hold their convention at the November or the January show.

An important feature of the November and January shows will be the holding of conventions by the various organizations, and also the holding of meetings that will be addressed by experts in the various departments.

Peace Delegates at Buckingham Palace

His Majesty Entertains Balkan and Turkish Delegates at Luncheon.

LONDON, June 7.—King George entertained the peace delegates of the Balkan States and of Turkey at luncheon at Buckingham Palace today, to celebrate the signing of the treaty of peace. Other guests included the Duke of Connaught, governor-general of Canada, Premier Asquith, Foreign Secretary Sir Edward Grey, and Viscount Morley of Blackburn, lord president of the council.

While peace is being celebrated in London, the situation in the Near East is still threatening. The position of the Servian cabinet is said to be unsafe, but the resignation of the ministers had not been announced up to noon today.

Foreman Insults Flag: Men Strike

Nearly Two Hundred Boilermakers Strike Because Canadian Insulted Stars and Stripes.

NEW YORK, June 7.—The 170 boilermakers employed at the Fletcher Iron Works in Hoboken, who went out on strike on Thursday, because they claimed that their foreman, a Canadian, had insulted the Stars and Stripes, returned to work this morning. They now believe that they acted hastily and that perhaps the foreman did not so grossly insult the flag as they had been led to believe. The foreman denied that he had ever used the language attributed to him.

ALL ABOUT THE BIG MERGER.

Moving Picture Men Combine for Bigger Profits.

The most notable event of the week in the moving picture business is the organization of the "Big Merger," an undertaking only accomplished by the united efforts of a number of the most prominent men in the business.

Amongst the largest theatres now included in the merger are the "Orpheum Theatre of Cobalt," the "Grand Opera House of St. Thomas," the "Why? Theatre of Toronto," and the new "Bohemian and Teck Theatres of Toronto."

The company is named the Amalgamated Moving Picture Shows, Limited, and was organized during the week under the Ontario Act, with an authorized capital of \$500,000, divided into \$5,000 shares, each of the par value of \$100.

The charter gives the company permission to buy, sell, lease or operate, as principal or agent, moving picture theatres and other kindred projects, and (b) to manufacture, buy, sell, trade or deal in films, machines, equipment, furnishings, decorations and other theatrical apparatus, and (c) to do all other such things as may be found necessary to the welfare of the business.

The "Why? Theatre," at 622 Bloor street west, Toronto, has a seating capacity of 325, and averages a net profit of \$4,350 per annum, or over 20 per cent. on the total investment.

The "Bohemian Theatre," now being constructed at 350 Yonge street, Toronto, will have a seating capacity of 600, and will average a net profit, it is estimated, of \$10,000 per annum, or 50 per cent. on the total investment.

The "Teck Theatre," now being constructed at 708 Queen street east, Toronto, will have a seating capacity of 900, and will average a net profit, it is estimated, of \$6,500 per annum, or 33 per cent. on the total investment.

The "Grand Opera House," at St. Thomas, has a seating capacity of 1,000, and will average a net profit, it is estimated, of \$10,000, or 50 per cent. on the total investment.

It is evidently the intention of the company's management to control many of the largest and most profitable houses in this country, and a perusal of the foregoing will disclose the fact that they are making rapid progress in this direction.



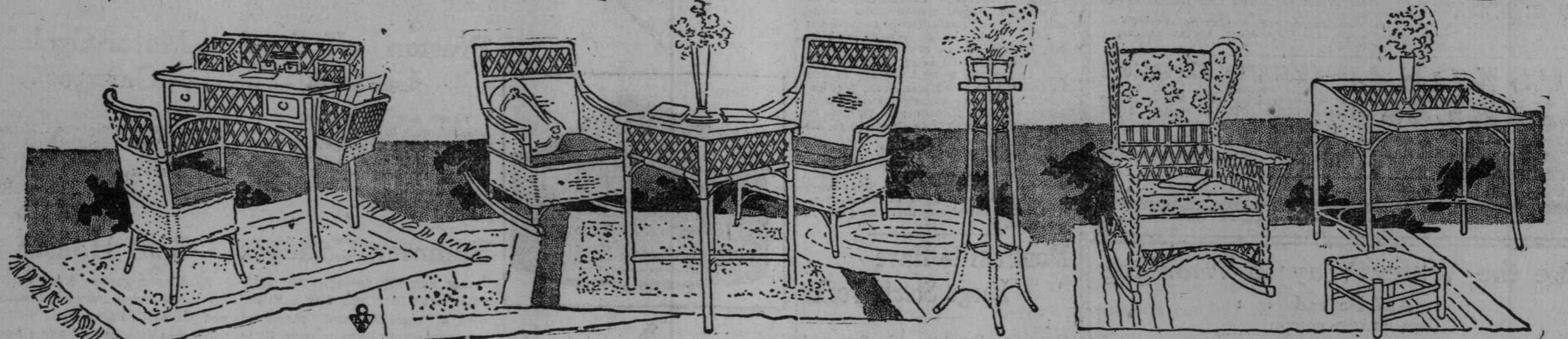
