## THE MACEDONIAN QUESTION RAISED IN THE BRITISH HOUSE OF COMMONS

London, July 28.—The Macedonian question was raised in the House of Commons last night. Sir Edward Grey, Secretary of Foreign Affairs, said that the situation had changed suddenly and greatly in the last few days, if Turkey herself was going to improve the whole Government and the country to benefit Mussulmans and Christians alike. It was better, he said, that the Macedonian question should thus be settled by the Turks themselves than that partial re-forms should be presend upon reluctant and obstructive authorities. "We ought for the present," added the scentary, "to preserve an expectant and sympathetic attitude toward these changes." 
