BUSINESS MEN FOR WORK ON FARMS

An additional 10,000 men will be required on western farms this spring if an adequate acreage is to be seeded, according to the estimate of R. B. Chapman, director of national service. Mr. Chapman suggests, and a similar recommendation has been made by the Canadian Council of Agriculture, that a patriotic appeal be made to city dwellers to save the situation. Retired farmers, men engaged in business, and the thousands of soldiers who were released from military duties last year are of course no longer available. It is suggested that business firms continue the salaries, on part at least, of members of their staffs engaged in this work, and that a fair rate of payment be made by the farmers for work done, the amount to be devoted to patriotic funds by such city men as might thus receive double pay. Co-operation of farmers' organizations will be necessary and the matter of effectively mobilizing workers is now under consideration.
