BUSY MORN FOR LADY ABERDEEN

Meeting With Local Council of Women One of the Features
An interesting meeting took place this morning in the Natural History Society rooms when Lady Aberdeen had an informal talk with the ladies of the Local Council of Women. Miss Grace Leavitt presided in the absence of the president, Mrs. Thomas Bullock, who is ill at home. Miss Leavitt welcomed Lady Aberdeen. In this city today she said there were many reforms under way and naturally strengthened by the message that the marchioness would bring, there should be greater endeavor and more reforms.

There were present representatives of the King's Daughters, St. John W.C.T.U., Protestant Ophan Asylum, Natural History Society, Educational and Humane Society, High School Alumnae, Wednesday Evening Literary Club, Victorian Order of Nurses, Church of England Hospital, Needle Work Guild, Women's Canadian Club, Alexander Temple of Honor, St. John Society for Prevention of Tuberculosis, St. Monica's Club and Women's Suffrage Association. In a discussion of the care of children, Lady Aberdeen asked if there were any milk depots in the city. She explained how the mortality among children had decreased in Dublin as the result of the Women's Health Society, a possible place for a similar project of establishing a milk depot. The pasteurizing of milk was also strongly urged by the marchioness.

There also was discussion on the grants of the school trustees to the free kindergartens. As the name of each affiliated woman's society was called the delegates or delegates arose and discussion followed on the work carried on by the society. With pointed questions on the part of Lady Aberdeen some practical hints as to the best way to attain telling results were brought to light. Following roll call, Lady Aberdeen said that the results to be gained from the marchioness's talk were evident to all. This morning the real value of all the women's council was demonstrated. The marchioness's talk was a great link between all societies. She laid stress on the advantage of the council meeting often and exchanging ideas.

The great call today was the need of every ounce of energy in the gigantic business of war-work. The problems of the day were not only to be met but to be met in the end. She found every thing very well and expressed herself as being much pleased. At noon she visited the headquarters of the Soldiers' Comforts Association, corner King and Germain streets, and the manner in which the work was accomplished highly pleased the marchioness. She complimented the women.
