OFFER \$20,000 REWARD FOR RETURN OF \$100,000 JEWELS Believed the Thief Who Stole Mrs. Sherwood Aldrich's Necklace is Known. That the person who stole the \$100,000 necklace owned by Mrs. Sherwood Aldrich, from her home in Southampton, L. I., on the night of June 30 last, is known, is indicated in an advertisement in a New York paper, being a time limit for the return of the necklace. If not returned to its owner by October 2 at the latest the \$20,000 reward will be withdrawn and the inference is that the person who made the rich haul was sufficiently familiar with the location of the small fortune that even the marks on the porch post did not impress detectives as the work of professional porch-climbers. Soon after the robbery much mystery was made of the identity of the owner. It was first reported, say that no other deduction can be drawn from the advertisement. They also have scouted the theory that professional burglars had taken the pearl necklace and masquerade diamond ring, having held all along that the person who made the rich haul was sufficiently familiar with the location of the small fortune that even the marks on the porch post did not impress detectives as the work of professional porch-climbers. On the following morning Mrs. Aldrich awakened with a headache, and there is now a strong suspicion that she was drugged by the intruders. Search was made for the jewels, but they were gone.

MISS MARION HAMMOND RETURNS FROM WAR ZONE Nurse Now Visiting Her Mother in Augusta; Thinks War Will Last Long Time. Miss Marion Hamblin, formerly assistant superintendent of Knox hospital, has returned from France, where she has been engaged in Red Cross work the last three months, and is now with her mother, Mrs. John A. Hamblin, Augusta, Me.

"It looks now as though the war would not end for some time," says Miss Hamblin. "I was unable to find any one in my travels who predicts an early closing of the war. From all reports received, Germany appears to have plenty of food and ammunition to last for quite a period, and until there is some apparent shortage, the Allies do not expect to make a great deal of headway. "French soldiers are very enthusiastic, however, and feel confident that the allies will eventually triumph. The slaughter in France has been great, but the soldiers keep up their courage remarkably well. "I was stationed at a place called Fort

Mahou in France and the hospital was a sort of French resort town on the sea coast. The hospital was arranged to accommodate from ninety to 150 patients at a time. Although we were fifty miles from the battle front, there were times when we could distinctly hear the cannonading. Our nearest point to a railway station was twenty miles away, and the patients were brought to the hospital in improvised ambulances. Most everybody that had an automobile truck donated it to the service. "I heard many thrilling scenes related by some of the patients and there were instances when remarkable heroism was shown. I never before realized that such fortitude could be displayed by the survivors of battles. Some of the pleadings of the sick ones to get in touch with their relatives or hear from some of their friends were pitiful. In some cases soldiers had left their homes hurriedly, with families more or less scattered before their departure, and not a word had been received of their whereabouts. "Most of the patients had shrapnel wounds, and these prevailed to such an extent that a good deal of surgical work was often necessary. "The place is full of sand dunes and down these dunes on tea trays. There was a fairly good beach and the nurses have a good time going in bathing."
