NO SIGN OF PROMISED CIVIL SERVICE REFORM

Ottawa, March 21.—In the annual report of the civil service commissioners, just made public, they say that the relative standing of applicants in the examinations for entry to the outside service plays but a minor part in the selection of those who may be appointed. "Most of the positions in the outside service are made under the usual terms of the patronage system and those who are temporarily appointed, upon securing a place on the qualifying list, are confirmed in their positions."
