NEEDLE IS WORN BY STITCHES OF TIME

Cleopatra's Needle, One of Sights of New York, Grows as It Crumbles.

Cleopatra's Needle, although many centuries old before it was transplanted from Egyptian soil to Central Park, New York, is growing. If somebody does not stop the process, it may keep on growing until nothing remains, because the mere fact of its expansion aids the elements in the process of disintegration, and the more the Needle grows the less it weighs. Ancient obelisks may be never too old to grow. At any rate, Engineering and Contracting of Chicago points to the Needle to support the theory that stones progressively expand, the process accelerating the ravages of weather.

Twenty years ago the slow, relentless

disintegration of the stately obelisk was first observed. It was attributed to the fact that the gradual expansion of the stone, which was not arrested. Particles of the monument that resisted the ravages of weather changes in Egypt for centuries are still dropping off, and nobody knows how to make it immune to the wear and tear of time.

Many centuries from now the Needle may have a decidedly triangular appearance, as the disintegration is more pronounced on the south and west faces than on the north and east. This may be attributed to the fact that the south and west faces are exposed to greater weather stresses, but expansion may be assisting weather in its ravages.

Engineers, of course, know that stone expands almost as much as steel when temperature is raised, but the fact is not so generally known that stones expand progressively during a period of years if subject to alternate hot and cold. An instance of a slab in old St. Paul's churchyard is cited as an instance to prove this contention.

In St. Paul's churchyard, New York city, at the right of the church, there is an inscription slab that is originally horizontal, says the article. "Its two ends rest on stones, but otherwise it is not supported. The slab is about six feet long and its middle sags fully six inches below the level of the ends. This also is a very old stone, which, as we recall it, is about six inches thick and three and one-half feet wide. Evidently the slab has elongated in the course of time, and gravitation has pulled it downward during the process of elongation."

New Orleans Stones Elongated.

The bowed slabs bearing inscriptions in the St. Louis cemetery, New Orleans, are advanced as another example in the argument to prove the progressive

expansion theory. These tombs or burial vaults are built entirely aboveground, because graves cannot be built in the water-soaked earth. Many of them are more than 150 years old. The marble inscription slabs, one inch to two inches thick and about three feet long, were originally set in the recesses in the masonry of the tombs. The upper and lower edges of these slabs still touch the masonry, whereas the middle part of the slabs bows out away from the obelisk, showing that the slabs have elongated since they were put in place a century or more ago. "May not the swelling of pavements be attributed to progressive expansion?" adds the author of the Chicago theory.

NEW WAY OF SELLING GAS.

May Be Bought by "Heat Unit" in England.

The Yorkshire Post, in its issue of November 10, states that a change in the method of charging for gas is now proposed, according to a statement by Sir Auckland Geddes. The suggestion is that, instead of buying gas by the cubic foot, the consumer should buy it on the basis of the heat it is capable of developing, as for nearly all uses to which gas now applied its heating value is the desideratum.

Under the new scheme of charging, the consumer will be presented with a bill for so many heat units instead of so many cubic feet. The meter will now cubic to register cubic feet, but the consumer's bill will be rendered in terms of "gas units." The gas undertaking will be called upon to show what is the calorific value of the gas it supplies, and by multiplying the cubic feet registered on the meter by the calorific value the number of units to be charged for will be arrived at.

Gas consumers may be puzzled at first by the new method of charging, but there is very little mystery in it. A British thermal unit (B.T.U.) may be described as the quantity of heat required to raise one pound of water one degree Fahr. A gallon of water weighs ten pounds. It follows that when one cubic foot of gas is burned it will contain two pints of water, to bring the water from an average of 60 degrees Fahr. to the boiling point of 212 degrees Fahr. one must use 880 B.T.U. It is proposed that the new "gas unit" will contain sufficient heat to boil 200 such kettles of water (supposing there is not waste of heat in the operation). The price of the "gas unit" will vary in different towns.
