ANOTHER CALL TO CHILDREN OF CANADA'S SCHOOLS

The mayor of London, Ont. E. S. Little, has addressed the attached letter to pupils of the schools of the Dominion. This bulletin is going all over Canada in a series of letters from prominent mayors addressed to school children.

Mayor's Office, London, Ont. To the Children of the Public and Separate Schools in the Dominion of Canada.

Dear Girls and Boys—Do you realize that one of the greatest assets of any country is its manhood and womanhood? And do you realize that you are an even greater asset than the present "Grown Ups"? Their work is partly done, but yours is only beginning, and you have a wonderful opportunity to profit by their mistakes.

We "Grown Ups" have tried to carry on the government of our country in order to provide "Life, Liberty and Happiness" for all, but there will always be room for improvement. Our forefathers fought for these principles, and we look to the young people to do even better than they or we. In one particular especially you can perhaps do more than we can—that is in the prevention of accidents.

Statistics show that in this country during 1919 there were more than three persons accidentally killed every day in the year and many more injured.

The fire losses in 1919 amounted to over twenty-three million dollars in this country—and most of these accidents and fires, we are told by people who should know, were preventable. Will you help to stop this waste?

Children often run risks because they think it shows bravery, and more often because they are approaching a dangerous and reckless person, and never runs risks to help a friend? Remember you have no right to take undue chances, for should you become maimed you are a charge on your parents or fellow citizens.

Two good slogans for you to bear in mind are: "Stop! Look! and Listen!" whenever you are approaching a dangerous place; and "It is my Duty to Protect the Property and Lives of Others." If we keep this advice before us, we should make bigger and better Canadians.
