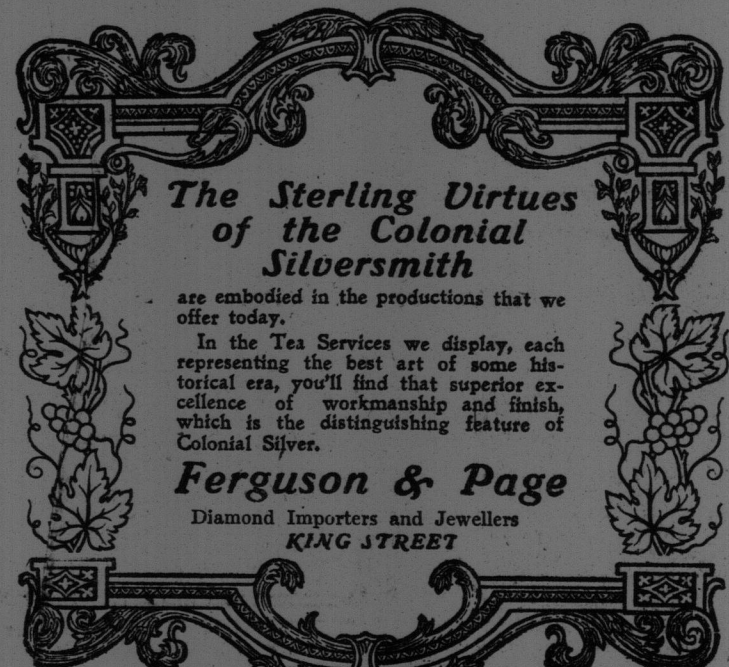

CHANGE THE WHOLE DOMINION PRISONS SYSTEM

Institutions Out of The Sphere Of Politics and Under Control of Commission

Ottawa, Feb. 20.—Reform of the whole system of administration of Canadian penitentiaries is quite within the range of probabilities of this year's legislative session. Much will depend upon the report to be presented next month by the board investigating the conditions of the institutions, but it will not be surprising if their findings takes the form of a recommendation for the closing of these penal institutions from political and political considerations in respect to the selection of the staffs. It is believed to be quite probable that the penitentiaries generally may be at under the direction and management of an independent commission, which would be responsible to the government of the day in a measure, but would have ample authority to deal effectively with the whole domestic administration of the penitentiaries, selecting their staffs and prescribing the penal conditions to be followed. The penitentiary officers and guards place of being classified as belonging to a particular penitentiary, would be liable for service in any institution under the commission, thus permitting daily of such periodical changes as might be necessary to obviate some of the abuses established in the inquiry at Kingston.

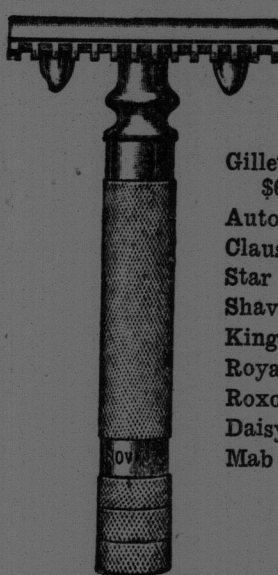

TO BRIGHTEN THE DECLINING DAYS OF O'DONOVAN ROSSA

Fund Being Raised in Greater Boston For Him Has Reached \$1,570

(Boston Post.)
The O'Donovan Rossa fund, collected by the Greater Boston contingent of the Federated Irish Societies of Massachusetts to make easier the last days of the celebrated Irish patriot, had reached \$1,570, with promises of further contributions last night. Treasurer John B. O'Higgins was empowered by the executive committee to forward the sum by a special committee at once.
The fund has been raised in six weeks by personal contributions from all over New England.
President Charles J. McCarthy said last night that with the sum raised and such other contributions as may come in, the declining days of one of Ireland's staunchest friends may be greatly lightened. He told the members present something of the history of O'Donovan Rossa who, at the age of sixteen, braved famine and plague, and later endured British prison for the cause of Ireland. "He raised \$100,000 for the famous 'Irish fund,' he raised money, sympathy, activity and principles for the freedom of his countrymen, but he raised never a dollar for himself. He gave to those who needed it as fast as he earned it."
"At the present time O'Donovan Rossa is in St. Vincent's Hospital, New York. The Irish cause is ever on his mind, and, at the age of seventy, our old friend and ally is drawing near the sunset of his life."

CANADA CAR WORKS

(Amherst News)
A representative of the News made a tour of the Canada Car Company's extensive plant yesterday and despite unfavorable business conditions found that the number of men on the pay roll was well up to the average. The rolling mills which have been closed for three weeks are again operating at full blast and the axle shop which was closed for repairs will resume work tomorrow.
The passenger shed is working to its full capacity and a night shift will be put on to keep the work moving more rapidly in this department.
In the box car department the orders are not up to the usual standard and the management have been giving employment in other departments to the regular staff operating in this big producing plant.
This department is, however, turning out daily a number of I. C. R. steel frame box cars and has orders for steel frame box cars from the Cape Breton Coal, Iron and Railway Company and from the Dominion Coal and Steel Company. The company is also turning out a number of contractors' dump cars to Messrs. Cavich and Pagano, the railway contractors engaged in the construction of the Eastern railway line in Halifax county.
The company is just now preparing plans for a special reservoir tank capable of holding 800,000 gallons of water as an auxiliary for the power pump and motor will also be installed in connection with this reservoir and with this added power the work will be more supply to that section of the town.

While we have heard that the company is some slack in the freight shed department and the outlook for the next few months is not the rosy one they would like, the company is planning big things for the future as the management is confident.

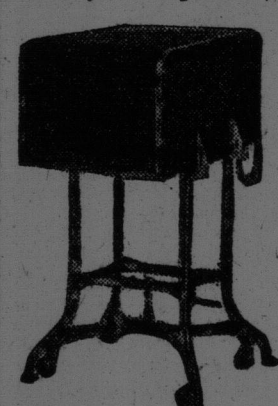

MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

Percy A. Guthrie won the contest in York county, N. B., for a seat in the provincial legislature from James M. Scott, by a majority of about 640 votes yesterday. The vote cast was light owing to the condition of the roads, through the county. M. F. McLeod, M. P., aided Guthrie in his fight, making the by-election almost his own personal contest, but his candidate was defeated at Canterbury station where he spent the day at work. The breach between the two factions of the Conservative party

is considerably widened because of the contest.

Homes were swept away, orange orchards washed out, two lives lost, and damage estimated at from \$300,000 to \$1,000,000 done in a storm in southern California during the past few days. Several towns in the foothills were cut off from outside communication and the homes of thirty Mexicans in one section were demolished. At points near Los Angeles a precipitation of from six to eight inches of rain was recorded in two days.

The Nova Scotia legislature was declared open yesterday at 3 p. m. by His Honor Lieutenant-Governor MacGregor.

The last census has shown a considerable increase in certain sections in population and in view of this additional representation is to be provided in the legislative assembly.
