LOCAL PASTORS ON THE WAR SITUATION
In a powerful sermon in the first Presbyterian church, West Side, Rev. W. C. Kierstead, P.D., of Fredericton, told of the cause of the war and summing up declared that war was wrong, the present conflict proving that the whole of our present day civilization was not Christian but that at times war appeared necessary when one nation seemed determined to appeal to brute force. He spoke in commendation of the deliberation and the calm judgment shown by Great Britain's public men before entering upon the war.
Rev. R. J. Haughton.
"A just cause and God" was the subject of the sermon delivered by Rev. R. J. Haughton to a large congregation at the Congregational church last evening. His words on the present crisis in the history of civilization and of the British race especially were of hope and of encouragement. There was in the sermon a feeling that the loss of honor and uprightness in nations and individuals is more to be feared than the greatest war.
Rev. H. E. Thomas.
In the Carleton Methodist church last evening, Rev. H. E. Thomas referred to the war in a sermon based on Revelation xix-6: "Hallelujah, the Lord God Omnipotent Reigneth." It was possible for the Christian man of faith to sing this song of faith in the sovereignty of God in the face of all the strife and carnage of the present hour, he said. The grounds for this faith in God's reign were found first in the law of law and order in the world and in illustrations from human life.

CANADIAN CANDIDATES AT NEXT GENERAL BRITISH ELECTIONS
(Times Special Correspondence.)
London, July 28—It is generally expected that the next general election will bring more Canadian candidates for parliamentary honors at Westminster into the field. Nowadays there are so many wealthy men from the dominions who are living here permanently that it would be surprising if they did not invade the political field.
Discussing this question the other night a member expressed the opinion that there would naturally be an increasing tendency in that direction. The recent session had illustrated how many questions had a "Canadian" side. Interdependent already to a certain extent, the policies of Great Britain and the dominions might be expected to become more so in the future; and recent events had shown how necessary it was that representative Canadian opinion should be adequately expressed at Westminster. Canadian and Australian members would add greatly to the legislative strength of the house, quicken imperial interest on this side and was particularly advisable in view of the fact that the development of those dominions would materially increase their power in the administration of the empire.

LA MARQUISE DE FONTENOY
The Plight of the Dowager Empress of Russia on the Outbreak of the War—Two Ambassadors
(Copyright, 1914, by the Brentwood Company.)
While the present war has long been regarded as inevitable, the startlingly sudden nature of its outbreak has been demonstrated among other things by the fact that it caught the Dowager Empress of Russia away from home, staying with her sister, Queen Alexandra in England. With as little delay as possible she left for St. Petersburg, traveling by special boat from Dover to Calais, and thence by special train.
Before the train had traversed more than half of Germany, the crisis had progressed so far that railroad communication between Russia and Germany had been broken off. The Kaiser accordingly caused the widowed Czarina's special train to be stopped and gave orders that she should be informed that it could not be permitted to proceed to the Russian frontier, but that she was at liberty to return to England by the way she had come, or else to withdraw to her native land of Denmark.
"But she should have found herself in the power of the Kaiser on the outbreak of a war between Russia and Germany, in the very striking uniform of a captain of Prussian dragoons. Making his way across the Place de Invalides, he was quickly surrounded by a hostile crowd of hoodlums, yelling, "Down with the Prussian! Death to the Prussian! Let us throw him into the river!" At the same time hooding and hissing him.
Von Schöen was quite alone, having become separated from his friends. He never turned a hair, sauntered along without hastening his steps in the slightest degree, but carried himself in a manner that prevented anyone from actually jostling him. In fact, it was his cool and courageous bearing that saved him from an actual injury, until he reached the portals of the German embassy, where fortunately a large body of police were assembled.
Had Baron von Schöen been subjected on that occasion to any harm, it would undoubtedly have precipitated France into the war that has now been inaugurated. But the mob was deterred from subjecting him to any physical injury by his gallant bearing, and by his cool indifference to danger.

GERMANY'S MADNESS

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Von Schöen gave evidence of this at the state funeral of old Marshal MacMahon, which occurred when French public opinion was intensely wrought up against Germany in connection with the Dreyfus scandal. The mob at the obsequies got out of hand, defying the police. Many of those who had taken part in the ceremony were unable at its close to find their carriages, and were forced to return home on foot.
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
