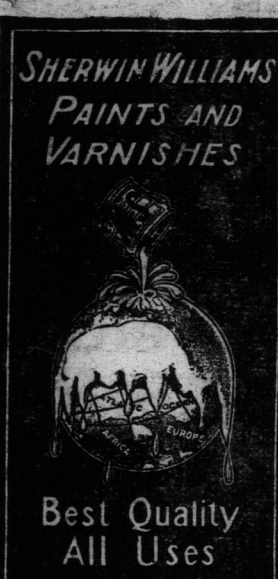

News From Labrador

(Editor the Guardian).
Ailik, Labrador, April 25, 1914.

Dear Sir.—Just a word to say that Mr. Joseph Chard has arrived from his trip in the interests of the Game and Inland Fisheries Board from Cape Harrison to Hebron. The time taken was six weeks. He travelled with his own team of dogs and without a driver. He endured much hardship and hunger, as food was very scarce in the far north.

In one instance he was caught out in a snowstorm for 6 days alone, and only managed to reach Hopedale by killing one dog to feed the others, and surviving and almost dead he arrived at Hopedale after 6 days of the roughest weather without seeing any human being.

After a day's rest and with the aid of an Eskimo and an additional team of dogs, he pushed on to Ailik. At this time he had recovered quite a bit, but limbs and body are badly swollen yet.

C. H. E. Exams

The examinations conducted by the Council of Higher Education are being held in the various centers around the Island this week, commencing June 22nd. The various tests submitted have generally speaking been fair, with a few exceptions which were, we understand, beyond the ability of the candidates taking these respective subjects. At Bay Roberts centre 31 candidates are sitting, while 28 are at Coley's Point. Mr. Norman is Supervising Officer at the former centre and Mr. Powell at the latter. The College of Precursors of London, Eng., compose the examining body. The results of these examinations will be awaited by us with interest, both locally and generally. Do we ever ask ourselves as to the benefit we are deriving from our present system of examination and education? or can a better be adopted?

Alarm in Every Cabin

There ought to be an alarm-bell system on all steamships by which the Captain, by simply pressing a button on the 'bridge', could set a loud alarm ringing in every cabin on the ship. In fact, a set of signals could be arranged which would enable the Captain to convey at once to the passengers his notion of the pressing nature of the 'summons.'—Exchange.
