MAKES DEFERRED TRIP.

Service for Magdalen Islands.

Halifax, March 28.—The Magdalen
Island steamship service was again
discussed by the council of the board
of trade, A. B. Wiswell appearing be-
fore the council on behalf of the Mag-
dalen Island Traders' Association.
Without it being generally known a
contract was given a Quebec firm
to conduct a service from Quebec to
Gulf points, and also another service
from Pictou to the Magdalen Islands
calling at Souris. This contract is for
the sum of \$70,000 for five years, and
it is reported that the company has
been unable to obtain a
suitable boat and propose placing a
trawler on the route, which it is con-
sidered, would be unsatisfactory from
every standpoint. A telegram from
the Magdalen Island merchants, was
read, asking the board to co-operate
in obtaining a suitable service on
this route; after discussion it was
decided by the council to ask the gov-
ernment to place one of its own steam-
ers on this service if the Quebec com-
pany failed to procure a suitable
steamer. It was announced that the
steamer Stanley would make a trip
for the purpose of carrying mails and
freight, leaving Halifax tomorrow
morning.
