St. John, May 9.—(By the Associated Press.)—Thomas Nelson Page, the American Ambassador to Italy, has announced his intention to resign at the conclusion of peace, it was learned in high quarters in Paris today.

JAPANESE FEELING AGAINST AMERICA RAPIDLY GROWING

Newspapers Call President Wilson Hypocrite, Despot and Transformed Kaiser.

Tokyo, May 9.—(By the Associated Press.)—The anti-American campaign in the Japanese press continues with renewed force.

The belief is expressed here that the basis for the agitation is fear of the growing influence of the United States in international affairs, as evidenced by her position at the peace conference, and that it will act as a curb on what are regarded as Japan's legitimate aspirations in China and Siberia.

The participants in a mass meeting held on Sunday, at which some anti-American speeches were delivered, announced their intention of continuing the demonstration in front of the American Embassy.

The Yorduki Choho says the Americans responsible for attempts at anti-Japanese legislation on the Pacific slope indicate that the Americans persecute Japan in everything while wearing the mask of liberty and fairness.

"Hypocrite," "despot," "transformed Kaiser," "man with the voice of an angel but with deeds of a devil," are some of the epithets applied by the newspapers to President Wilson.

At a meeting of the Kikumoto party, held in Osaka, a resolution was passed declaring that recognition of the Monroe Doctrine by the League of Nations should be interpreted as recognition of Japan's predominance in the Far East.
