BEVOLVING LIGHT, ENTRANCE TO HALIPAK HARBOY.

The Government of the Dominion of Canada has given notice, that from the 2lst August 1872, a Light would be exhibited from a Lighthouse recently erected on Chebucto Head, at the west side of the entrance to Halifax Harbor.
