ANOTHER DELAY MAY BE POSSIBLE

Paris, Dec. 31.— Although the supreme council today fixed January 6 as date for signing the Protocol and exchanging ratifications for the German peace treaty, complications are developing which is it believed bt some persons in Coancil circles may again cause a past-ponement of the ceremony, of patting the treaty into effect.

It has developed that the German technical delegate arranging the details connected with the pledistic cites to be held, do not appear to have full power to act. The sining of the protocol on January 6th, therefore may depend upon whether the Germans can secure powers immediately in order to compute the arrangements which ought to precede the exchange of ratifications.


