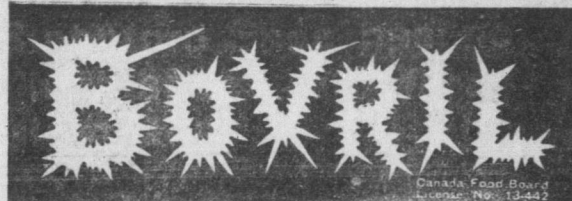

wine alone to the electors.  
Both liquor and temperance factions  
in the Province wages an energetic  
campaign the former securing pow-  
erful support from a number of the

most prominent men in Montreal.  
No women voted on the referendum.  
In the Province as a whole the  
"wets" turned out in great numbers  
while the "no" element seems di-  
fferent. In Montreal the "wet" majori-  
ties were enormous, in several divi-  
sions being over seventy-five per cent.  
The referendum result will ensure  
the sale of wine and beer in districts  
only where local legislation has not  
introduced prohibition "Dry" dis-  
tricts though allowed to vote will  
not become "wet" even though they  
gave a majority in favor of wine and  
beer.

Montreal shows a total of 44,340  
for and 4,106 against while West-  
mount voted 3,419 for and 2,172  
against. Other centres such as Sher-  
brooke, Three River, Hull went in  
favor of light wines and beer by con-  
siderable majorities.

Only in one locality in the pro-  
vince was the temperance sentiment  
emphatic enough to offset the wet  
organization. This was in the Eng-  
lish-speaking eastern township. The  
majorities for a complete "dry" state  
were, however, quite small.

The new liquor legislation, which  
will be given effect to as a result of  
the referendum, will come into force  
will come into force on May 1 next.  
The districts which will be affected are



Montreal Sherbrooke, St. John's and  
the few municipalities which still grant  
liquor licenses.

## The Prospects for Canadian Racing

TRACKS ARRANGING FOR AC-  
TIVE SEASON—WAR BAN  
LIKELY TO BE LIFTED  
AT ONCE.

Ottawa.—While the Government  
has announced no decision in re-  
gard to racing, all of the tracks  
throughout the country are appar-  
ently arranging for their meets this  
spring, lining up the horses and en-  
gaging their staffs.  
The ban has been on since August

of 1917. It provided that during  
the war and "for six months after  
its conclusion racing with the pri-  
vilege of betting should be prohi-  
bited. A good deal turns on what  
the six months refers to. If it be  
six months from the cessation of  
hostilities the ban, automatically  
will be raised next month. If the  
six months date from the declara-  
tion of peace the situation will be  
different. From all that can be  
gathered here racing will come back.  
The Government inclines to the  
view that many restrictions imposed  
as a matter of war expediency may  
now properly be lifted, and they are  
supported particularly by the "blue  
sky" party in Parliament.

## Quebec Gives Big Vote For Beer & Wine Sales

BOTH CITIES AND DISTRICTS  
VOTE WET  
Montreal April 10—The referendum

taken in the Province of Quebec to-day on the question of wine and  
beer licenses showed, according to  
early returns that an enormous ma-  
jority voted wet. Both cities and  
country districts were in favor of the  
restoration of licenses.  
The referendum was decided on by  
the Provincial Legislature to settle

the future liquor question. In 1918 the  
Legislature passed a total prohibition  
measure to come into effect on May 1  
1919 for "the duration of the war".  
The war ending before the act could  
be applied, the Government com-  
promised on the demands made from  
the liquor faction who demanded a  
continuance of complete "wet" privi-
