A Mill has been selected for the new church building to be erected by St. Andrew's congregation, Perth.

The pulpit of the Markdale church was occupied for the last two Sabbaths by Mr. L. C. Ems, of Knox College.

On Monday evening, 4th inst., Rev. Principal Grant delivered an address in Ottawa on "Imperial Federation," Chancellor Fleming in the chair.

At the next meeting of the South Huron Ministerial Association, papers will be read by Rev. Mr. Henderson, of Henshall, and Rev. W. M. Martin, of Exeter.

The pulpit of St. Andrew's, Lindsay, was occupied 10th inst., by Rev. J. B. Muir, of Huntingdon, Que. The previous Sabbath by W. D. J. Martin, of Knox College.

On Monday evening, 4th inst., Rev. Principal Grant delivered an address in Ottawa on "Imperial Federation," Chancellor Fleming in the chair.

At the late meeting of the Presbytery of Ottawa, Rev. J. M. Crombie, of Cumberland, signified his acceptance of the call to Coie des Neiges, Presbytery of Montreal.

MR. HOSSACK of Knox College, it is stated has received a call to St. Andrew's church, Oranville, with an invitation to preach as often as possible, until he finishes his college course.

The sermons in connection with the Blythe anniversary services were preached by Rev. J. A. R. Dickson, of Galt. On the following Monday evening, Mr. Dickson delivered a lecture on "Dreams."

REV. DR. A. T. PIENSON, of Philadelphia, author of "The Crisis of Missions," will deliver a lecture in Association Hall this evening (Feb. 14th) at eight o'clock on the subject: "The Place of Young Men in the Plan of God."

REV. ALEX. HENDERSON, of Hyde Park, preached, Feb. 13d, the sermons in connection with the anniversary services of Edmondville congregation. At the tea meeting, on the following Monday, addresses were delivered by Revs. J. A. McConnell, S. Aheson, J. H. Simpson, F. Musgrave, A. D. McDonald, and A. Henderson.

THE pulpit of the Brampton church has been occupied for the past two Sabbaths by Rev. Robert Chambers, of the American Board Commissioners Foreign Missions, for some years a missionary stationed at Erzurum, Turkey. Mr. Chambers was formerly pastor of St. Andrew's church, Whitby and has many warm friends in the Canadian church. His experiences while labouring in Erzurum and vicinity are full of interest.

PRIOR to his leaving for the Northwest, Rev. R. M. Craig, who for the last five years has been pastor of Highland Creek, was entertained at a farewell social of the congregation, and presented with a purse of \$100 and an address, expressive of their great regret at the severance of the pastoral tie. It is worthy of mention that during Mr. Craig's pastorate, about 100 names have been added to the roll of the congregation, and two new churches have been built at a cost of upwards of \$10,000.

THE members of Knox Church Bible class, Regina, recently presented the pastor, Rev. A. Urquhart, with a well filled purse, and a Mrs. Urquhart with a handsome china tea set accompanied with their appreciation of Mr. and Mrs. Urquhart's solicitude for the young people of the congregation. Mr. Urquhart made a suitable reply. On the same occasion the Board of Managers presented Mrs. Watson, organist of the church, with a purse and address.

THE first anniversary of the opening of the Glenallan Presbyterian church was observed on the 13th ult. The weather was favourable and the attendance at all the meetings was large. The Rev. R. J. Beattie, of Guelph, preached morning and evening. The following evening a tea meeting was held, when addresses were made by Rev. Messrs. Beattie, of Guelph, and Cameron, of Harrison, the chair being occupied by the Rev. H. Norris, pastor of the church. The Methodist choir of the village furnished excellent music.

Though a number had left the town, the membership was on the whole, greatly increased during the year. The congregation is looking forward to the time, in the near future, when their valuable property will be entirely free from debt.
