Ed. at Toronto, settled in B.C., April, 1862. M., May, 1866, Susan, dau, of the Rev. Canon Ritchie, of Georgina, Ont. A merchant. Was a mem. of Ex. Council and Chief Commr. of Lands and Works from Dec., 1872, until the resignation of the Walkem Govt., 27 Jan., 1876. Apptd. a Gold Commr. May, 1873. Apptd. Minister of Finance on resignation of Elliott Administration, 1878. Became Premier, Presdt. of the Ex. Council and Chief Commr. of Lands and Works, in June, 1882, a position he held until he resigned with his colleagues on 26 Jan., 1883. Was Secy. of the Confederate League in 1868, which took the initiatory steps in B.C. to unite that Colony with the Dominion of Cana a, and upon Confederation taking place and responsible Government being introduced, was first returned to Leg. for present seat at g.e. 1871; reelected at g.e: 1875, 1878, 1882, 1886 and 1890. Is leader of the Opposition.—Corner of Vancouver and Beechy Sts., Victoria.
