Father, the late Andrew Barberie, represented the Co. of Restigouche for twenty years prior to Confederation, and held the office of Clerk of the Crown for N.B., and other important offices in the County. He was a Conservative in politics. B. in Dalhousie 1 Feb. 1835. Ed. at Dalhousie Grammar School M. in Bathurst, Gloucester Co., N.B., 7 June 1866, to Elizabeth, dam of the late John Phillips, Esq., ex-M.P.P. Has been Clerk of the Peace, Registrar of Probates, and Captain in Restigouche Militia. Is now Clerk of the Municipality of Restigouche. First returned to Parlt. at last g.e. A Liberal.—Dalhousie, N.B.

BEVERIDGE, WILLIAM B. (Victoria.)

S. of the Hon. B. Beveridge, M.L.C. A merchant, and Postmaster at Andover. An unsuccessful candidate for Victoria in House of Commons, at g.e. 1867. First returned to present House at g.e. 1874. Re-elected at last g.e. A Liberal, and in favor of the free non-sectarian school system,—Andover.

BLACK, JOSEPH LAURENCE, J.P. (Westmoreland.)

Grandfather came from Yorkshire, Eng. He was a brother of the late Bishop Black, of the Methodist Church, who died in Halifax, N.S. B. in Amherst, N.S. Ed. at Amherst schools and at Sackville, N.B., Academy. M. 17 Aug. 1861, Miss Mary Snowball, dan, of late Rev. John Snowball, of the New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island Conference. Apptd. Justice of the Peace 1863. Has been three years Presdt. of the Sackville and Westmoreland Agricultural Society. Is Presdt, of the Alumni Society of Mount Allison Wesleyan Academy and College, and representative of sail Society on the Board of Governers of that Institution. First returned to Parlt, at last g.e. A Liberal Conservative in Dominion politics. Independent as between Local Government and Opposition.—Sackville, Westmoreland Co., N.B.
