amount of money apportioned to each, the aggregate amount of the apportionments, and the ratio of population according to which the several apportionments shall have been made:

Seeing to ap. pliention of moneys.

Thirdly.—To see that all moneys apportioned by him, 5 under the authority of this Act be applied to the purposes for which they shall have been granted, and to withhold from each and every County from which a satisfactory report respecting the moneys last apportioned thereto shall not have been received, all further share of the 10 Legislative Grant for Schools till such report shall have been furnished by said County.

Preparing forms, &c.

Fourthly.—To prepare suitable forms and regulations for making all reports, and conducting all necessary proceeding under this Act, and to cause the same, with such 15 instructions as he shall deem necessary for the better organization and government of Public or Common Schools, to be transmitted to the several Boards and Officers required to execute the provisions of this Act.

Furnishing forms, copies of Act, &c.

Fifthly.—To furnish, from time to time, to the order of 20 any Superintendent of the Common Schools of any Township, Town or City in Upper Canada, such and so many copies of this Act, and of the forms, regulations and instructions prepared by him, as shall in such order be stated to be necessary for the use of any School or Schools 25 in said Township, Town or City.

Collecting information.

Sixthly.—To employ all lawful means in his power to collect information on the subject of education, and to diffuse it among the people in Upper Canada.

Reporting to

Seventhly.—To submit annually to the Governor of this 30 the Governor. Province, on or before the first day of August in each year, a report of the state of the Normal, Grammar, Common and other Public Schools or educational institutions in Upper Canada, shewing the amount of public moneys expended for educational purposes in Upper Canada, so 35 far as the same shall have been made known to him, and shewing likewise from what sources the said moneys shall have been derived, together with such information respecting the state of education in Upper Canada, and plans and suggestions for the improvement thereof, as he 40 shall deem to be expedient, in order that the same may be laid before the Legislature at the meeting thereof next following.

School monies payable to County Treasurers.

III. And be it enacted, that the sum of money to be when and how annually distributed for the encouragement of Common 45 Schools in Upper Canada aforesaid, shall be payable on the first day of May in each year, by warrant to the Treasurers of the several Counties in Upper Canada.
