II. And be it further enacted by the Authority aforefaid, That fo much of an Act, made in the Tenth Year of the Reign of His prefent Maj-fty, (intituled, An AA for continuing fo much of an At, made in the Third Year of His prefent Majefty's Reign, intituled, . An At to continue and amend Two Acts, made in the Twenty-first and Twenty-eighth Years of His late Majefly's Reign, for encouraging the making of Indico in • the British Plantations in America, and for extending the Provisions of ' an AEt of the Thirtieth Year of His late Majefly's Reign, with respect to · bringing Prize Goods into this Kingdom, to Spanish Prize Goods taken fince · the late Declaration of War with Spain,' as relates to encouraging the making of Indico in the British Plantations in America, and for explaining fo much of an Act made in the Fifth Year of His present Majesty's Reign, as relates to the regulating the Fees of the Officers of the Customs in America, and for extending the fame to the Naval Officers there), as relates to regulating the Fees of the Officers of the Cultoms, and of the Naval Officers in the Britif Colonies in America; which Act was to be in Force from the First Day of August One thousand seven hundred and seventy, for and during the Term of Two Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Seffion of Parliament, and which was by Four Acts, made in the Twelfth, Fourteenth, Nineteenth, and Twenty-third Years of the Reign of His present Majesty, further continued until the First Day of August One thousand feven hundred and eighty-fix, and from thence to the End of the then next Seffion of Parliament, at which Time the faid Act expired; and also to much of an Act passed in the Sixteenth Ycar of of 15 Geo. 111, His Majefty's Reign, (intituled, An AEt for the further Encouragement of relates to recs the Whale Fifbery carried on from Great Britain and Ireland and the British of Officers of Dominions in Europe; and for regulating the Fees to be taken by the Officers of Newfound the Customs in the Island of Newfoundland), as relates to the Fees of the land, revived, Officers of the Customs in the Island of Newfoundland; which Act, tinue in Force as to fuch Part thereof as aforefaid, - was to have Continuance fo long as the faid Act, passed in the Tenth Year of His Majesty's Reign, should be continued and remain in Force; and which Act of the Sixteenth Year of His Majefty's Reign is therefore now no longer in Force; shall, from and after the passing of this Act, be revived, and fo much and fuch Parts of the faid Acts as aforefaid are hereby revived, and shall continue in full Force and Effect from the passing of this Act, for and during the Term of Five Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Seilion of Parliament; and every Collector, Comptroller, and other Officer of His Majefty's Cuftoms, and every Naval Officer in the faid Colonies respectively, shall be, and they are hereby declared to have been, from the Time the faid Acts expired and ceafed to be in Force respectively, and for and during the Continuance of this Act, entitled to afk, demand, take, and receive, fuch Fees as they would respectively have been entitled to ask, demand, take, and receive, if the faid Acts had been continued and remained in Force respectively.
