Gentlemen

Just now received the Surprizing news that fifty Indians from Canada were about o days ago in the Lake at the Otter Greek ut a defign to fall on some of your out Settlements we think it our Duly to acquaint you with this Intelle--gence without any Lots of Time hoping that you may be on your Guard at the fronteers to frustrate the Barbarous & Bloody Defigns of these Inhumane Brutes whose mercy is nothing but truetty we that be good to hear that this Indian War may foon leafe that Christians may not be murthered and falls as a prey to those salvages, and that this Intelligence
