Dear Mr. Ryckman:

I quote the following three paragraphs from a letter received from H.J.A. MacEwan, our candidate in North Huron. -

"Spotton, while outwardly claiming to be with us was doing everything possible against us through his agents who were actually out, drawing in voters for J.W. King - while many other voters were canvassed to remain at home, because if MacEwan is elected, Spotton wont get another chance.

Spotton complained to me very bitterly that the Conservative party had not paid his law costs.

We do not know whether J.W. King's agents have paid them or not but we would not be surprised if his Party had. King's own argument with the Conservative Progressives and others was that he had had only one session and his law costs in fighting the Spotton appeal had been so excessive, that he asked the special favour of one more vote."
