to No. 30 of this Band in 1882, and during
the last year, they separated for some
disagreement between them, in 1884,
she was paid with her husband.

No. 37 Amuletant, was Canceled
from off the Pay Sheet in 1880, for his
wandering living in the United States
Territory, he applied to be taken back
again in 1885, with a promise to
remain in his former Reserve, his
petition was granted by the Department
of Indian Affairs.

No. 25 Amuletant, one girl is married
to son of No. 30, of this band, see No. 44,
the other girl is married to son of No.
1, of Band No. 40, see No. 15, so leaves
two girls, the boy entered is a mistake,
No. 37 Amuletant, the child entered
as girl born is a mistake, it is a boy
that was born.

No. 44 Amuletant, is the son of No.
30, of this band, married to daughter of No.
25, of same band.

No. 45 Amuletants, transferred from
Fort Francis District, as well as those
of No. 46, if I am rightly informed, they
belonged to Band No. 17, the two widows
are the daughters of No. 14, of Assabasha
Band, No. 35. Mr. Indian Agent
father, handed me a list of the two
families in your office, in July last.
