Here may I be permitted to join with you, Mr. President, in extending a word of congratulation to Mr. Hughes and the Executive Staff on the vision they have displayed in depicting the development of the past twenty years, and bringing its possibilities and responsibilities home to the imagination of our people.

When I spoke here on August 27th, 1927, one province only had its permanent buildings on these grounds. In concluding my address, I said:

"I believe in time we shall see in these "grounds permanent buildings, not for Ontario only, "but for all of the Provinces, and buildings not for "our Dominion only, but for Great Britain and for all "of the Dominions. We shall see special exhibits "of the British colonies and possessions not alone from "Bermuda and Jamaica as shown to-day, but from all "other parts of the British Empire, and increasingly "we shall come to realize what an inheritance we have "in our Empire citizenship."

I went a step further. Touching upon the international character of the Exhibition, which was then just beginning to make its presence known, added these words:
