The accumulation of sawdust, slabs and refuse from the mill will be disposed of strictly according to B.C. Forestry Department regulations. The wood fuel as mentioned before will be available to the Indians and hauled to householders in the area as far as Nanaimo. The Sawdust will also be sold and any surplus disposed of in a proper manner. Slash burning and snag falling will naturally be observed according to Forestry regulations.

Regarding the Ground Rental, we feel that payment on the area up to 1612 acres may be excessive as we will be working on a small area on the Reserve at all times. However, we are willing to pay Ground Rental to that amount if absolutely necessary.

Referring now to your letter of May 15th, we accept the stumpage rates as outlined.

We trust that you will forward this application for the operation of a portable sawmill to Vancouver and Ottawa just as soon as possible so that we may get into operation without delay.
