As plicant must appear in person at the District. Entry by proxy may be mad at any Dominion Lands Agency for the District. A homesteader may live within a miles of his homestead on a farm of teast 80 acres, on certain conditions, anbitable house is required except when the sendence is performed in the vicinity. In certain districts a homesteader good standing may pre-empt a quartection alongside his homestead. Price is over acre.
