Bain, and forwarded by him to the British Museum, Prof. Owen has recently found a few water-worn fragments of bone which indicate a lung Theriodon reptile new to science. For this creature he proposes the name Titanosaurus ferox; a name suggestive at once of its great size and of its feroity. These characteristics are interred from the nature of the teeth. Possibly it found its prev in such creatures as the patricauri, the oudemotonts, and the tappinocephalans, which existed in the same geological period and in the same area. The new genus is founded on the merest fragments of bone.
