Departure of the Duke of Edinburgh.

Wednesday afternoon at 4 o'clock H. M. S., under the command of H. R. H. the Duke of Edinburgh, let go her moorings. Immediately the Royal Standard was hoisted, and the Duke's gun fired for the first time at this port, and the stately ship gathered way, heading to the northward. When the Royal ensign was shown the battery on the Citadel gave a salute of 21 guns, which was followed by another from the heavy main deck guns of the flagship Bellerophon and the Rover. The band of the Black Prince, which was stationed on the quarter deck, played "The Girl I Left Behind Me," "Good Bye, Sweetheart," "Auld Lang Syne," &c. The band of the Bellerophon played the National Anthem, and the sailors of the fleet manned both sides of the rigging of their respective ships and gave three hearty cheers. Then the band of the Bellerophon struck up "Auld Lang Syne," followed by "Home, Sweet Home." Three hearty cheers were given in return by the blue jackets of the Black Prince, and the noble ship proceeded down the harbor, with her pennant flying, bound for Portsmouth, England, to be paid off.—*Chronicle.*
