The Minutes of the last Meeting.

Friday, April 28.

The regular meeting of Town Council was held this evening.

Present.—The Mayor in the chair, and Messrs. Johnston, Campbell, Huxton, Bingham, Butler, Cameron, Dancy, Edward, Nicholson, Lee, Sloan and Swanson.

Minutes of last meeting were read and signed.

Reports were presented from the treasurer, street inspector and sexton.

A petition was read from Mrs. Cattle, asking to purchase a piece of ground in front of her lots in the cemetery for the purpose of erecting a monument. Referred.

A number of accounts were presented and referred to Finance committee.

The market committee presented the following report:

That the present market by-law be amended by striking out the 12th section and all the words in the 11th section following the word "otherwise," and the insertion of the following:

"12th"—That the fees for weighing and measuring shall be as follows: Load of hay, 15; slaughtered meat, or grain, or other articles exposed for sale, under 100 lbs, 2c; over 100 lbs, 3c; over 1,000 lbs, 10c; live animals, other than sheep or pigs, per head, 5c; sheep and pigs, if more than 5, per head, 1c; if less than 5, 4c; load of wood, 5c.

That the word "poultry" be inserted in the 5th section, after the word "cork wood."

That the collection of fees under the by-law be let by tender under the direction of the market committee.

The Finance committee recommended the payment of the following accounts: John Story, \$7.30; D. C. Strachan, \$6.25; Star, \$6.88; D. Ferguson, \$19.54; W. Mitchell, \$8.13.
