Turkey Demands Revision of Sevres Treaty.

Asiatic Ideals Menace to Australia-France Will Not Recede on German Payments--Swedish Steamer Stoked Across Atlantic by Aristocrats--One Day's Toll of Murders and Ambushes in Ireland.

TURKEY AND SEVRES TREATY.
 CONSTANTINOPLE, Feb. 3. Turkish demands to be represented at a coming conference in London on the Near Eastern Question will be the number. According to the Turkish press, the demands are: First, abrogation of the privileges of Greece in the Smyrna region under the treaty of Sevres; Second, autonomy for Thrace; Third, maintenance of Turkish sovereignty over Turkish territory; Fourth, modification of economic clauses of the treaty, which infringe upon Turkish sovereignty and independence; Fifth, modification of the military clauses, so that Turkey will be enabled to maintain a defensive army.

YELLOW PERIL FEARED.
 BRISBANE, Feb. 3. In a speech here to-day, Premier E. G. Theodore declared that anyone who doubted that Australians would soon be called upon to defend their homes against Asiatic invasions were living in a fool's paradise. Asiatic threats and aspirations, he added, were a menace to the ideals of the Australian Labor Party.

FRANCE MUST BE PAID.
 PARIS, Feb. 3. France still intends to see that Germany is made to pay her debt in full if her economic conditions permit of such payment. Premier Briand informed the Chamber of Deputies to-day, in presenting the declaration of the Ministry on the reparations question.

BRIAND APPROVES.
 PARIS, Feb. 3. The French Parliament Chamber and Senate gave its seal of approval to the government's decision on the reparations taken by the Supreme Council at Paris, respecting reparations, disarmament and other questions. It received Premier Briand's declaration with all outward and visible signs that promise a large majority in the vote of confidence, which the Briand Cabinet will seek to-morrow.

CHECK MATE.
 NEW YORK, Feb. 3. The Swedish line, Gothenberg steamed into New York to-day under

power furnished by the brawn of millionaire clubmen, college professors and the general elite of Sweden. Sigurd B. Jorkstrum, Port Engineer of Gothenburg and Director of the Swedish American line, which controls the vessel, was Chief Engineer, and his twelve stokers were recruited among the aristocracy of Gothenburg. When the regular crew of fifteen struck for higher wages, the former Chief Engineer of the vessel had demanded that his salary of 14,000 Krona a year be doubled. If his demands had been met, the steamship officials said his salary would have exceeded by 2000 Krona that of the Swedish Minister to the United States. The aristocracy of the boiler room to-night, removed their denims, donned more formal clothing and started out to see New York.

FIRE VICTIMS.
 WINNIPEG, Feb. 3. The fire which burned all night, gutted the interior of the Dingwall block, Albert Street, resulting in the death of one of the firemen, and the missing of another. Approximately the damage is estimated at more than \$300,000.

GRAFTER FOUND GUILTY.
 NEW YORK, Feb. 3. Robert P. Brindell, President of the Building Trades Council, to-night was found guilty of the charge of extortion from builders by a jury in Justice McAvoy's court here.

PROHIBITION IN ACTION.
 WASHINGTON, Feb. 3. Doors of distilleries and bonded warehouses in every state in the union, Hawaii and Porto Rico were or-

dered indefinitely closed against liquor withdrawals by Prohibition Commissioner Kramer yesterday. At the same time wholesale liquor dealers were ruled out of further participation in the sale of intoxicating liquors by Attorney General Palmer.

ADMIRAL TAKES STRONG STAND.
 PARIS, Feb. 3. Admiral Dumesnil, commander of French naval forces in the near east, has sent an ultimatum to the Turkish National government at Angora demanding the immediate release of the French soldiers captured by Nationalists in recent engagements, says a Matin despatch. He has threatened to bombard Nationalist localities.

MESOPOTAMIA MANDATE.
 LONDON, Feb. 3. Great Britain's mandate for Mesopotamia will be submitted to the Council of the League of Nations at its meeting at Geneva, Switzerland, February twenty-first, according to newspapers. The Times and Mail feature the announcement, and the Mail emphasizes its great diplomatic importance.

BOLSHEVIST OUTRAGES.
 BOMBAY, Feb. 3. It is reported that Bolsheviki have destroyed all shrines at Bohara, Central Asia, executed Chief Ghazi and murdered or imprisoned the leading officials and citizens.

FOUR KILLED.
 DUBLIN, Feb. 3. Four men are dead as the result of the ambush of squad of auxiliaries at Ballinalee yesterday, two having died of wounds last night. One of the motor lorries was blown up by the mine set in roads.

POLICE KILLED.
 DUBLIN, Feb. 3. A number of auxiliary police were ambushed yesterday at Ballinalee. Two of them were killed and nine wounded.

BOMB THROWING FAILS.
 DUBLIN, Feb. 3. Attempt to ambush three military lorries was made in Bishop Street last night. Four bombs were thrown, but none of the troops in the lorries were injured. They opened fire smashing several windows, but the assailants escaped.

ASSAILANTS KILLED.
 SKIBBEREEN, County Cork, Feb. 3. Six members of a party said to number several hundred Sein Feimers, were killed and several others wounded in an attack last night upon a detachment of fifteen police between Burgada and Rossacbarry. The attack was beaten off and the police suffered no casualties.

NINE POLICEMEN MURDERED.
 DUBLIN, Feb. 3. Nine policemen were killed and two wounded to-day when two lorries ran into an ambush between Drumken and New Pallas, County Limerick.

FREEDOM OF TRADE.
 ROME, Feb. 3. Establishment of freedom of trade by Italy will be accomplished at the earliest possible moment, declared the Italian Senate yesterday. "But," he added, "this action must await the establishment of international markets." Referring to recent visits to Paris and London the Under Secretary said as Francis was inimitable.  NEW ORLEANS, Feb. 3. Peter Jackson, delegate of the Seamen's Union and three other men were arrested yesterday charged with interfering with United States commerce by forcing the crew of the schooner Edith, who had shipped at less than union wages, to leave their vessel when about to sail. The men are said to have directed an armed party of twenty-five in the operation.

MURDERED BY UNKNOWN PERSONS.
 DUBLIN, Feb. 3. The court martial enquiry into the death of Commissioner Holmes, last Friday, returned a verdict that he was murdered by unknown persons.

ENDORSES ATTITUDE.
 BERLIN, Feb. 3. Reichstag parties through their leaders yesterday endorsed the Government attitude on the Paris agreement. The debate, which lasted three hours, was dispassionate, barring interruptions during the Communist leader's speech the sole dissenting note in chorus of approval.

SLEEPING SICKNESS.
 LONDON, Feb. 3. Reports of new cases of sleeping sickness have been made by physicians here. There are now one hundred cases in London and three hundred and twenty-one in England and Wales.




